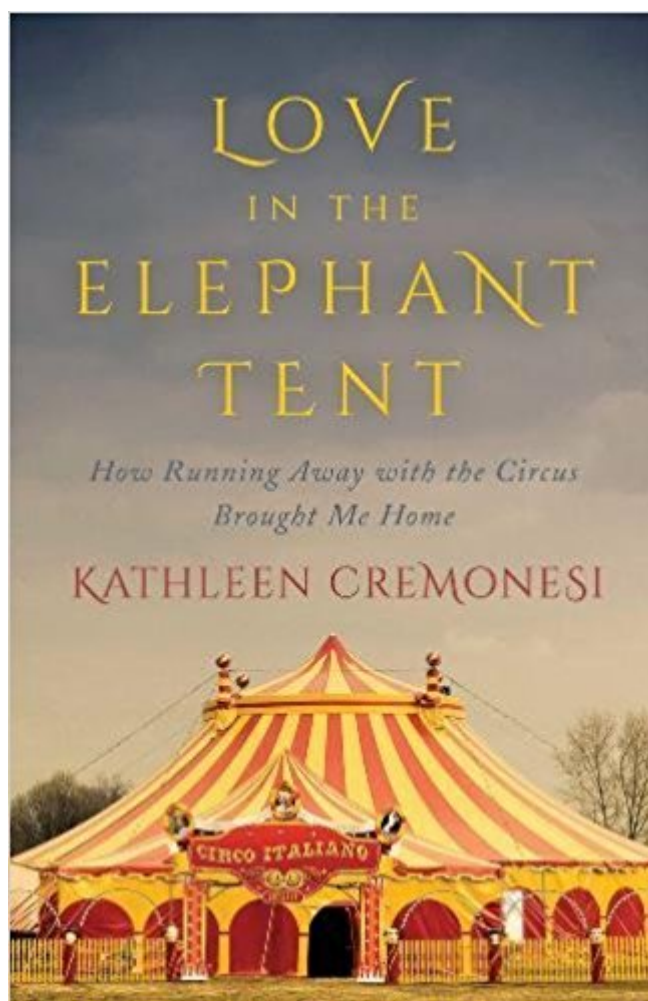

Kathleen Cremonesi lives near Eugene, Oregon, with her husband and a family of cats and dogs. She had the honour of volunteering at a Thai elephant sanctuary that she still supports with charitable contributions. This is her first book.

I am always looking for a good read, and rarely do I find a book I can ease into and resonate with as much as this one. Kathleen's background is similar to my own, and she writes with such a fresh and direct style that reading it is true pleasure. Her story of traveling with the Grateful Dead, then on to Europe, and the Italian circus may be an unusual path, but her telling of it makes it truly relatable. Her experience of falling in love with an Italian elephant trainer in the circus is beautiful, and she totally captures the emotions of finding love at a young age-(23 years old). The setting of the memoir is so interesting, and I appreciate how she incorporates her mature reflection on circus reality with her first impressions of the time. The stories of the people and animals in the circus are so fascinating, and told sensitively. And I want a Stefano of my own! Its a beautifully crafted book, and very romantic. The photo section in the middle is a great touch, too. I've laughed, and I've underlined passages I know I will return to for help with my daily perspective. This book is well worth a read!

A story of coming home to one's heart, Kathleen shows us the inside of the Italian circus, her love of and respect for animals (her friendship with Baros the giraffe is remarkably sweet), and her struggle to set aside childhood pain over broken love in order to allow love--in its imperfections--into her life. Her descriptions of Italian men and culture are priceless, as are her insights into the side of circus life outsiders never see. Parts of Kathleen's story are laugh-out-loud funny (her description of her multi-faceted "courage" before entering the shark tank for the first time, her description of her changing appreciation of her "ample bosom" among others), parts are incredibly poignant--all worth the read. From landscapes to Italian cooking, Love in the Elephant Tent also delighted my senses and evoked my imagination. Kathleen Cremonesi is a brilliant writer and Love in the Elephant Tent is pure delight. The development and ultimately maturation for her love with her soulmate Stefano is an inspiration. I highly recommend this book!

I bought this book because Kathleen's mom is a friend and found myself reading it, with delight, in two days. Kathleen's writing style is charming and funny and her honesty in telling her story, warts and all, is admirable. She writes with wit, sympathy and a delightful style, pulling the reader along to the next event. I couldn't stop reading! Her descriptions of life in the circus sent me to the internet to see what Circo Moira Orfei looks like and that added to my sympathy for all that goes on behind the scenes. I got a kick out of her cultural observations and tales of misunderstandings, language struggles and compromises. (I've lived overseas and had some similar experiences.) Reading of her developing love with Stefano and of their ups and downs was my favorite part of the book, and the photos in the center of the book make their attraction obvious. Her honesty about her own shortcomings in relationships along with his as well made their eventual marriage all the more gratifying. I'm happy for them and happy that I had the privilege of sharing in their story.
