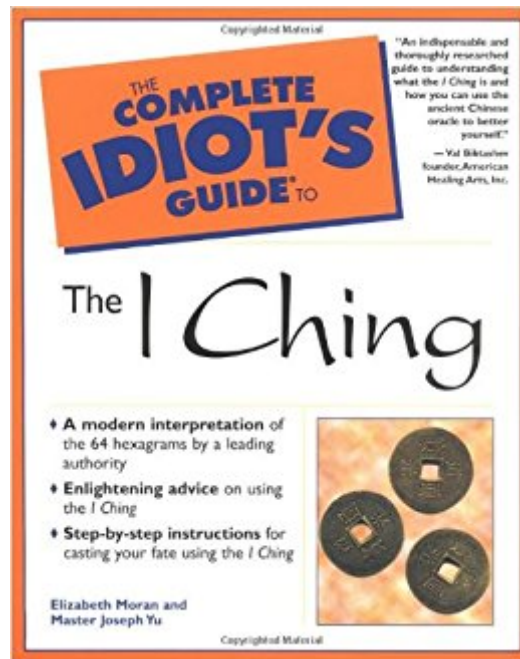

In Chinese, "I" means Change and "Ching" means Book; hence, the Book of Changes. By throwing or casting yarrow sticks, coins, or seeds and interpreting the way they fall, I Ching provides one of 64 hexagrams, or possible pieces of advice.

I found this book in a 2nd hand bookshop and bought it out of curiosity as much as anything else. I am old enough to feel comfortable fooling around with strange stuff! I have been a regular meditator

for many years and live in hope of some day attaining realisation - whatever that might mean. So - I asked the I Ching the following question - "what must I do to attain realisation in this lifetime?". The answer given was Hexagram 33 - "retiring". The book gives the following hexagram statement "retire. there will be success... GO ON A RETREAT!!!. Take a vacation alone." Couldn't really be more specific could it. I am not sure if I want to ask how long I have to go on a retreat though - I have a job and family. The strange thing is the Richard Wilhelm translation of the I Ching talks about retreat in the military sense of withdrawing from a battle - less appropriate than this book's statement. I have asked a couple of other questions related to my business - the answers given were appropriate and actually quite helpful. This is Truly strange. This book gives a good intro. to the I Ching and seems to be a good stepping off point. I have just added this to the review - it relates to the current disaster in Japan. It is about 2PM on the 19th March in Japan. The news tells me that the Japanese hope to get electrical power connected to one of the reactors in a few hours time. I asked the I Ching the following questions: 1. What will happen at the Fukushima nuclear power station? 2. What effect will the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear reactor damage have on the Japanese economy? 3. What effect will the same events have on the world economy? Well the hexagrams I got were pretty vague and seemingly irrelevant. Question one the numbers were 897 879 - "penetrating" hexagram, with 9 on line 2 and 9 on line 6. The future hexagram was 39 "obstructing". Question 2 the numbers were 687 887 hexagram "stopping" with 6 on line 1. the future hexagram was 22 "adorning". Question 3 the numbers were 967 787 - hexagram "brightness" with 9 on line 1 and 6 on line 2. the future hexagram was 50 "the caldron". I won't go into all the hexagram statements but they seem rather off track in terms of answering the questions, whether I use the "complete idiot's guide" or Wilhelm. So - the "answers" don't seem that relevant but maybe I asked the wrong questions. My earlier questions (my first using the Complete Idiots guide) were answered with seemingly appropriate responses. Go figure!

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
