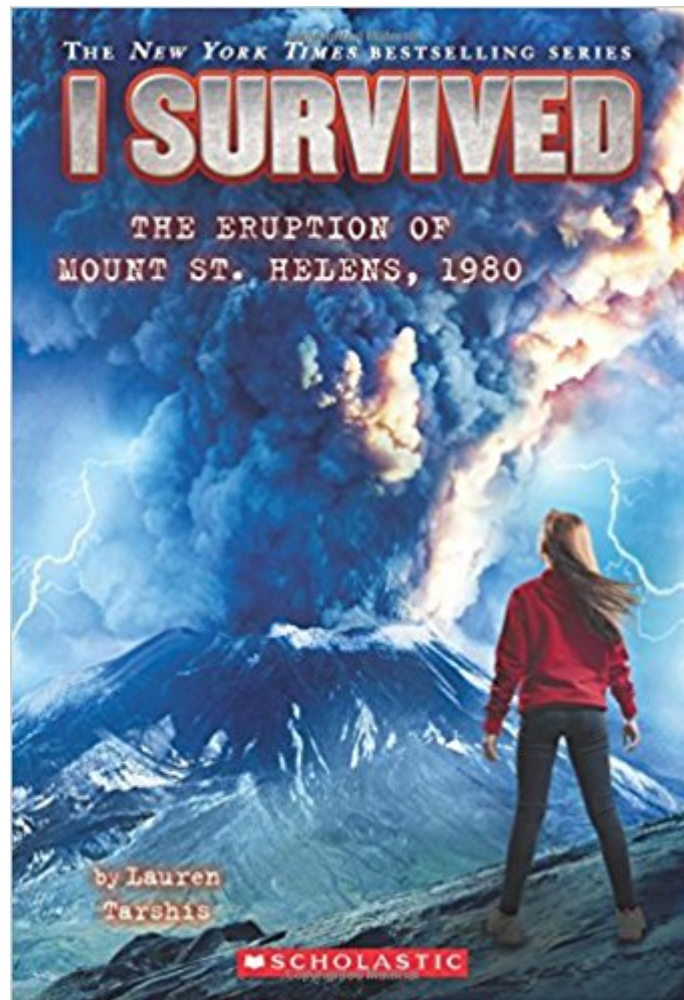




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I Survived The Eruption Of Mount St. Helens, 1980 (I Survived #14)
