

Synopsis

War "organized violence against an enemy of the state" seems part and parcel of the American journey. Indeed, the United States was established by means of violence as ordinary citizens from New Hampshire to Georgia answered George Washington's call to arms. Since then, war has become a staple of American history. Counting the War for Independence, the United States has fought the armed forces of other nations at least twelve times, averaging a major conflict every twenty years. In so doing, the objectives have been simple: advance the cause of freedom, protect U.S. interests, and impose America's will upon a troubled world. More often than not, the results have been successful as America's military has accounted itself well. Yet the cost has been high, in both blood and treasure. Americans have fought and died around the globe "on land, at sea, and in the air. Without doubt, their actions have shaped the world in which we live. In this comprehensive collection, Terence T. Finn provides a set of narratives "each concise and readable" on the twelve major wars America has fought. He explains what happened, and why such places as Saratoga and Antietam, Manila Bay and Midway are important to an understanding of America's past. Readers will easily be able to brush up on their history and acquaint themselves with those individuals and events that have helped define the United States of America.

Gr 8 Up "Twelve of the wars in which the United States fought are discussed here in a manner that is thorough yet concise. Finn "When Europe Went Mad (Pentland, 2009)" discusses the events, the reasons why the war was fought, and how the outcome was important to the United States. In

order for a war to be included, it had to meet the following criteria: it was large in scale, the enemy was a sovereign state, and the outcome had to influence the future of the U.S. significantly. Though the Cold War, French and Indian War, and the Panama Incursion are not included, each of the following has a chapter dedicated to it: the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican/American War, War Between the States, Spanish/American War, World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Persian Gulf, Iraq, and Afghanistan. While the technology and participants have changed throughout the years, it is clear that war is still a conflict of organized violence, the necessity of which many will disagree. A victory depends greatly on who is in charge and the available resources. Even though the trade title reads like a textbook, the pacing of Sean Pratt's narration makes it easy to understand and tolerable. Best for students looking for an in-depth picture of wars in the history of the U.S. or for those who are teaching the subject. Educated at Williams College and the University of Sussex, Terence T. Finn holds a PhD from Georgetown University. His career encompasses the National Aeronautics and Space Administration as well as staff positions on Capitol Hill. Finn is the author of two novels, *The Best of Times* and *To Begin Again*, as well as *When Europe Went Mad*, an account of the First World War.

A splendid little volume explaining twelve American wars, the whys, wheres, and whos. One major complaint is the total disregard and thus no mention of the U. S. Coast Guard. The Coast Guard has participated in every war American has fought - even back to the Quasi War with France! The Coast Guard is one of the five Armed Forces of the United States. While I enjoyed and will keep the book the omission of the Coast Guard makes me wonder what else was omitted.

This book gives the reader summaries of America's battles with commentary as to if they were successful or not, and helpful critiques of how they unfolded. The major military leaders of these battles are evaluated as to their leadership skills and the results or failures inherent in how they battles were carried out. Additional comments are made as to the significance/effect of the battles to U.S. history.

Excellent, exactly what I was looking for, a concise account of the Wars Americans have fought. How soon we forget, I was mostly amazed at the number of soldiers from all countries killed in WWI 8,000,000. It seems that war and sacrificing it all is part of the human make up, and sometimes for the most trivial reasons.
