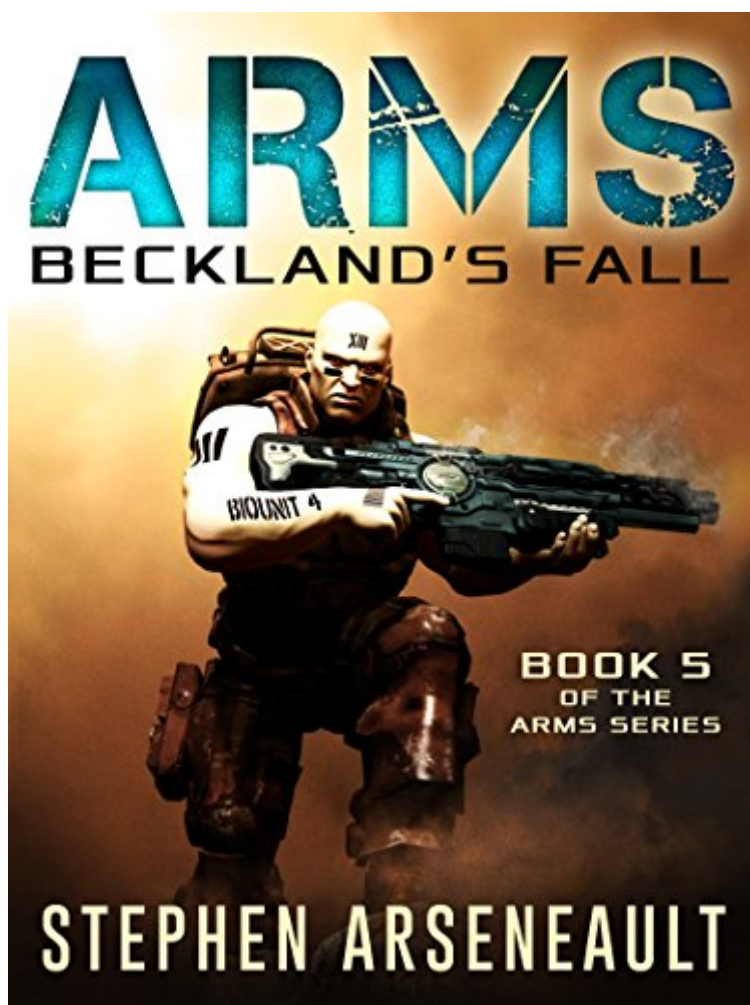


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ARMS Beckland's Fall

The first Stephen Arseneault books I read were the HADRON series, which I loved. After HADRON, I was afraid I was going to be let down by ARMS, but I love ARMS at least as much as HADRON - maybe even a little more. Stephen Arseneault writes with the perfect ratio of humor to drama and is a master at escalating to evermore challenging antagonists while maintaining believe-ability and suspense. In ARMS, he's created another multi-novel story that has kept me entertained and enraptured.

The New Earth Emperor is just as bad on the other extreme. He practices " Absolute power corrupts absolutely" to the extreme. Our hero's keep ducking and dodging, trying to keep up with the constant STUPIDITY of the two governments. There are lot of ups and downs in this episode of Arms making it an exiting experience for the reader.

Arsenault is falling back into his old patterns, relying on logistics and oddly specific timeframes to create a logistical solution to overcome the problem. Characters slowly develop but still feel somewhat one-dimensional, not really developing much though admittedly after 5 or 6 books the main characters do feel like they're coming along and even evolving a bit. The writing itself is probably some of Arsenault's best, far surpassing his earlier work in terms of technical elements but still relying too much on mostly irrelevant details and timeframes. This kills the pace somewhat, though it *is* a fairly steady pace. I just feel like most of the story can be told in a much quicker, much more interesting pace... but then we wouldn't have 15 volumes to look forward to I suppose. Is it worth reading? If you've been reading the series until now, sure. It's not a bad installment. But you'll plod through it and it'll all seem like familiar territory. Not terrible but nothing overspecial. It's basically entertaining enough, though.

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
