

This is a book for technophiles, revolutionaries, visionaries, reactionaries, financiers, historians, and philosophers, among others. And that is both its strength and its weakness, as the story is much more about its ideas and predictions than it is about its characters. The science presented is real, if perhaps a little on the extreme side, predicting a 50 foot rise in sea levels and what New York City would look like under such a scenario. New York's geology, terrain, and history are major players here, and those not familiar with the city may find themselves a little lost. At the same time, New York's flavor of being a giant melting pot and a nexus for 'where things happen' adds much to the basic story. There is a lot of cool tech arrayed before the reader, things that are quite possible, things that make the idea of New York as a still viable, complex, and giant world influence even while it is three quarters drowned very much believable. This is a story of how humans cope with disruptive events, and as such is highly optimistic, making this far from the dystopia one might expect, given its basic scenario. At the same time, Robinson's proclivity for presenting small-c communistic concepts of human groups and interactions I found somewhat pollyannaish, especially the ending, detracting from the overall believability of the story. A good read, complex, frightening and uplifting simultaneously, and something that perhaps a certain President should read and take to heart.---Reviewed by Patrick Shepherd (hyperpat)
