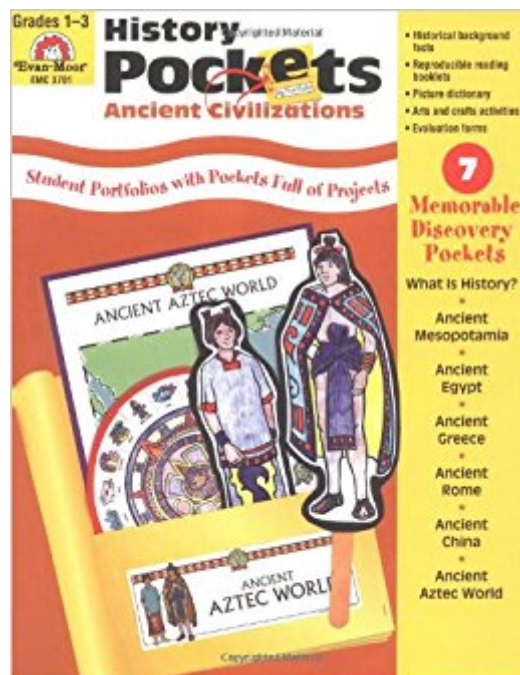

Synopsis

History Pockets Ancient Civilizations, Grades 13, contains seven discovery pockets. An introduction pocket gives an overview of the time periods studied. The other pockets focus on the food, shelter, clothing, and contributions of six ancient worlds. Each of the pockets contains: a reproducible pocket label, four picture dictionary words, a fact sheet of background information for the teacher, a reproducible student information booklet complete with illustrations, a postcard of a famous monument, two puppets to show the clothing, arts and crafts projects, and writing activities. As a culminating activity, the students put together a passport of all the places they have visited. This passport gives students a chance to reflect on all they have learned. The book includes the following pockets: What Is History?, Ancient Mesopotamia, Ancient Egypt, Ancient Greece, Ancient Rome, Ancient China, and Ancient Aztec World.

My GT students really get a kick out of the things they use from this book to help them learn about the ancient civilizations of the world.

I have a 1st grader gal and a preK guy and they both BEG for history because of History Pockets and Famous Figures of Ancient Times. (I use both in conjunction with Story of the World and extra library books and you tube videos and short documentaries.) It is a little extra work for mom, but so

fun. The upside is that they listen to history being read for long lengths of time while they work on their projects.

I am using this with our homeschool history curriculum with my daughter and she is really enjoying most of it. The definitions feel a little tedious to her, but I think they have the perfect amount of them. Just enough to ensure they are learning some new terms. She loves all of the other activities and I do feel it is helping to really make all of the information stick.

Everything is all laid out for me and that saves a lot of time. The information is simple but to the point. Even though my boys are a little old for this we use it as a base. I introduce the subject with the pockets then we go deeper as needed on our own. My boys were reading a book about ancient history recently and one said they saw a Ziggurat in it. I know they learned that from the Mesopotamia portion of this book, so they obviously are learning from it.

Wow I love this reproducible book! I use it to supplement my classroom unit on ancient civilizations. I find the activities to be really visual and my students learn so much more with the hands on elements. This will now be part of my lessons for years to come.
