

The section in which he allows himself to be used as bait in a horrible K- experiment was hard to read, but worth it. His use of Island patois among the characters is a convincing character device. As a side note, some of it's readers might enjoy Barstow Bones, in which an Asian-American college student hides out in a post-Pearl Harbor Barstow movie theater while a while a gang of white

teen-age thugs, pursue him. When newsreel footage of a Japanese Zero being shot down shows on the screen, Tommy cheers along with the rest of the audience. He is, like the young protagonist of Eyes of the Emperor, first of all an American.

Eyes of the Emperor by Graham Salisbury is the novelized version of WWII dog test trials that used young Japanese men as "bait", believing that the Japanese exuded a different scent than Americans. These trials were authorized by President Roosevelt. Although this book was a YA adult book (I read it in less than 3 hours), it was interesting enough to keep me glued to the pages! 5 stars
