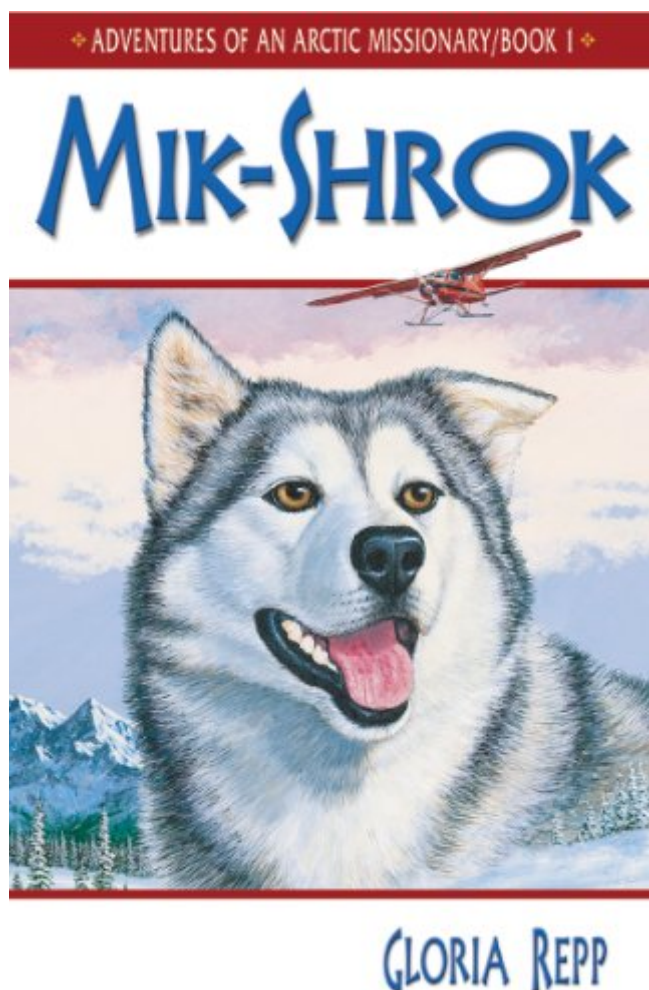


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Mik-Shrok (Adventures Of An Arctic Missionary Book 1)

The Alaskan terrain is dangerous, and the hearts of its people often seem harder than the frozen earth. Will Steve and Liz ever be able to reach the Eskimos for Christ? Meet Steve and Liz Bailey, missionaries from Chicago, now in Koyalik, Alaska. Steve is a pilot and Liz a school teacher. Having flown from Chicago to Nome, the couple were expecting to be met by

their contact, Peter. When he didn't arrive they got on a boat in rough seas in order to get to Koyalik. Where is Peter? In Seattle? Why didn't he meet them? Sadly he had a plane accident. The plane is lost and he has some bad injuries. Initially staying at the Trading Post, Steve and Liz wonder if they have made a mistake in coming here. They can't even speak the language of the Eskimos! Steve feels God's assurance that they are where they are supposed to be. Provided with a cabin why will the locals not come for a visit? How hard will it be to learn the language? Having grown up in Minnesota, Steve has handled dog teams in the past. Enjoy reading how the Lord provides them with five good dogs albeit with different temperaments. Steve and Liz also realize the need to learn the customs and integrate with the locals by helping them go whaling, hunting, eating the food etc. "The dogs know." Who said this to Steve first and how does Steve learn not just one valuable lesson but two?! How does Steve end up at Shanaluk meeting Joseph, Ben and Charlie? Pete writes to Steve and Liz about Mierow Lake, an Eskimo village with many who speak English. Some seem to know Christ but are yearning for more teaching. Can Steve and Liz make it there on the sled despite it being wintertime? Although this is a fictional story it reads as being VERY true to life. Set in the time period (1950) just before Alaska became a state, we thoroughly enjoyed reading this book as a family. Brought up a lot of questions from the children as well as keeping us wanting more! Very educational as well as inspirational!
