


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# Wellfleet, An Insider's Guide To Cape Cod's Trendiest Town

I read this prior to going to Cape Cod on a vacation. It had some helpful information, but most of it was based on one small part of Cape Cod. I was hoping to find out more about the other areas and tips on where to go and what to see. I did gain a better sense of Cape Cod and an appreciation for keeping it the way it is rather than large homes and hotels being built there. I would love to see Cape Cod in the winter. The writer describes the ocean views in the winter and I'm certain it is something to see!

If you are looking for a thorough background of historical Wellfleet, this is an excellent read. However, as a frequent Wellfleet visitor, don't look for too many new opportunities to explore or do. I was expecting more recommendations (dining) and specific locations of interesting sites. Several areas of interest were described in vague terms. For instance, "Visiting Wellfleet's Wartime Airstrip." Narrative like "near the spot where Marconi made wireless history...a twenty-minute hike through the woods...the edge of the cliff." So where was the old WWII Camp Wellfleet and

specifically the airstrip in this vast area?Disappointing for me, but could be useful to some.

This book is accurate. I grew up and fished off many bridges that are now gone. Worked on the fishing boats in the summer. We had one school bus that picked up the kid in South Wellfleet, dropped then off at the school on Lowell Street and then picked up the kids on the North side of town. After classes, we swam at Long Pond and everyone had a bike. What were empty fields and marshes, houses now exist. Its still beautiful, but now over built with too many tourist.
