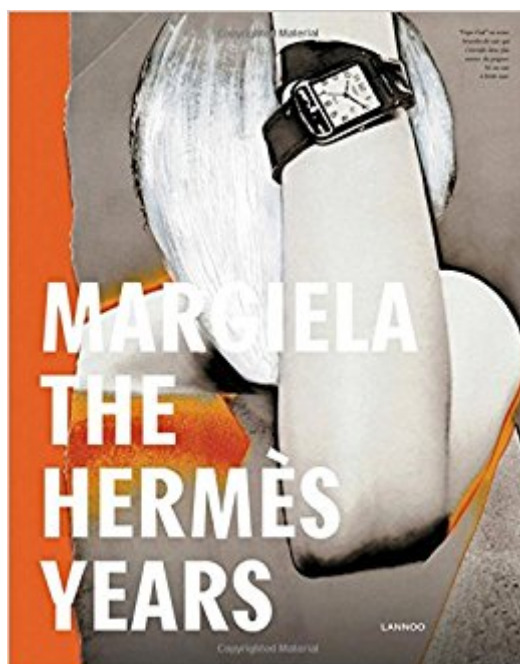

Every year, publishers put out another book on a fashion designer whose life and works we're so familiar with that at this point there's hardly anything NEW that we stand to learn from them. That said, there has been virtually nothing on the famed Belgian fashion designer, Martin Margiela, a cult

figure for many a fan of his works. And that's a shame because if there's any designer whose life is worth mining it's him. Try searching for a picture on Google and you're lucky if you find or two -- with good reason: the man has fiercely protected his image from being reproduced or taken in the years that he's been in the fashion industry (he took a step back from his own brand many years ago), a world not known for producing introverts. There is little, indeed, out there about him. So it comes as a complete and pleasant surprise to find a full monograph study on Margiela's works when he was a creative director for the French haute couture house, Hermes. Indeed, the pairing seems almost like a contradiction. What was the thinking behind the hiring of a young deconstructionist to helm the reins of a Paris stalwart? The book offers plenty of answers through interviews and essays with his collaborators over the years. The book is replete with studio images and advertisements showcasing Margiela's line at the time. MY favorite is a photo of a Bill Cunningham column in the March 19, 2000 NY Times showing various women in NYC walking around in Margiela-Hermes coats made out to look like comforters! Plenty of insights waiting to be discovered and re-visited here, especially for those who remembered seeing his lines first hand.

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
